We have already played Kinlough and will have some more games after Easter in this league.

We will also take part in a blitz organised by pupils in the TY GAA Leadership Program in Coláiste Cholmcille and of course Cumann na mBunscol football and Rounders.

In March, we took part in an *Active Break Every Day Challenge*. Every class had an active break every day for a week and we really enjoyed the fresh air and the sunshine.

Swimming will take place for 1st to 6th and our Rock Hub classes. We are delighted to be able to use the fantastic facilities in Ballyshannon Leisure Centre to develop water

On world book day, Mrs Lewis read Jack and the Flumflum Tree. It was a very funny book.




Ms Martin SET


