Recycle as much as possible.


Rather than buying plastic Easter eggs for your hunt, use wooden or felt eggs instead.

We have had a busy term in first class with lots of fun activities in all subjects.

We have enjoyed doing gymnastics, hurling and basketball in PE over the last few months. Swimming lessons are now underway which has led to great excitement.

We really enjoyed dressing up for St Patrick's Day and performing songs in Irish, including our national anthem Amhrán na bhFiann as part of our Seachtain na Gaeilge celebrations

We have done a lot of thematic Art this term to celebrate St Valentine's Day, St Patrick's Day, Mothers' Day and Easter.

In Maths we learned about pictograms and bar charts and surveyed our class on different topics before displaying these results in graph form. We also learned about money, fractions, 3D shapes and length. We enjoyed taking measurements of different lengths in the school environment.

In SESE we went for a nature walk to observe signs of spring in our environment. We learned all about the water cycle and the importance of conserving water. We learned that plants need sunlight, water and soil to grow and are currently carrying out experiments to demonstrate this. We also conducted experiments to determine the elasticity of a variety of balls and explored how sounds are made.

Other highlights of this term have been playing in the snow, getting hot chocolate and milkshakes from the Coffee Cottage, enjoying story time in the library for World Book Day and hunting for Easter eggs.









Mr Foley's 2nd & 3rd Class

Second and Third class have had a busy term in school. In SESE we have been learning all about lots of different types of jobs, how farming has progressed through the years and how the Vikings invaded Ireland. We have also completed lots of Science experiments which everyone enjoyed conducting.

In English we have been working really hard on our handwriting and we have been doing lovely creative writing pieces each week about our hobbies, prized possessions and many different story titles.

We have also been learning all about length and weight in Maths while 3rd class have been focusing very hard on multiplication and division with the help of Ms. Leonard.

Second class completed their First Confession in March. The way they all worked so hard to prepare and how they conducted themselves in the church was fantastic to see. As swimming gets underway before our Easter holidays, everyone is looking forward to resuming the lessons after the break.





Mr Sweeny's 3rd & 4th Class

3rd and 4th Class have had a great start to 2023 and are progressing well in all subjects.

We have done some very practical maths work recently in measuring length and distance using a variety of tools.

Our Irish classes were boosted by Seachtain na Gaeilge where we enjoyed quizzes, art, songs and dance as Gaeilge.

In English we used picture books for digital storytelling projects working with iMovie. You can see our recordings on the school You-Tube Channel. We read the novel

Danny Champion of the World by Roald Dahl and have worked hard to improve on



our writing activities.

We celebrated St Brigid's Day by inviting families of pupils into the class to help with making St. Brigid's Crosses. Mrs Mc Ginn, our Home School Liaison Teacher, proved to be a champion St. Brigid Cross maker and along with some expert parents and grandparents we produced 3 and 4 legged crosses that were just beautiful. Thanks to all family members who joined us on the day.



In Science we have experimented with Light, Sound and Electricity. We have learned about the Solar System and one of our pupils even organised a talk over Zoom with a NASA scientist in the USA. Thanks to Rhiannon's dad Oliver for a wonderful lesson.

We learned about habitats and changes that are taking place in the world and completed projects on Animals in Danger of Extinction.



We are keeping very active in class, regularly running laps of the school or dancing along with Go-Noodle. We have played some Rounders and Basketball and really enjoyed learning the events for indoor athletics and competing in Tir Chonaill Athletic's event in AVS Donegal Town.

Music is still featuring strongly with Brian is keeping us busy on the Ukulele every Monday and we are still practising away at the tin whistle.



Children participating in the Maths Recovery programme have been working on addition, identifying various strategies to solve addition problems and working on number word sequences counting forwards and backwards in 2's, 3's, 5's and 10.
