A Message from Mrs Lewis:


Dear Parents/Guardíans & Children,

Parent-Teacher meetings will take place on the 15th & 16th November. All classes will finish at 1:45 on both days. We can't wait to meet everyone face to face this year. There


will be tea and coffee available to parents in the Library with Mrs McGinn.

Mr McGroary's 1st Class

We have had a very busy and enjoyable first half term in first class.

In science lessons we have learned all about our senses. We carried out a number of experiments to test our senses of smell and touch. We learned about how submarines work and tested different objects to see if they float or sink in water. We also studied how light works and experimented with torches to establish whether certain objects were transparent, translucent or opaque. Also in science we went for a nature walk to observe signs of autumn in our natural environment.

In art we have been experimenting with colour mixing and have painted a number of pictures using the techniques learned.

We have enjoyed playing Maths games with Ms Leonard in 'Mata sa Rang. For Maths week we played card games and interactive games on the whiteboard, used Maths apps on our new iPads and built 3D creations using polydrons and magnatiles.

We have really enjoyed listening to the stories 'The Twits' and 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark' being read aloud. For PE we have played a wide

variety of running games both outdoors and in the PE hall. We have also had great fun playing word games and making jigsaws in class.

We really enjoyed our trip to the Abbey Arts Centre a few weeks ago to watch 'A Dog's Way Home'. We have also had great fun each Tuesday playing educational games on our new set of school iPads

3rd and 4th Class News

In maths we made Counting Sticks from recycled wood and brush handles to help us with our tables. We enjoyed Roald Dahl Day and rehearsed and performed *Matilda* for other classes in the school. In History we learned about the Bronze Age and there has been excellent work done at home on Designing and Building Bronze Age Settlements. The students in Rock Hub have settled back into school very well. They have been working hard on their reading and Math skills. We have been working on our fine motor and gross motor skills. In Spetember the students worked on games and athletics and went running with Ms. Curran's class in Munday's field. The Rock Hub students were lucky to take part in weekly Liquid Therapy sessions at Rossknowlagh beach where they experience sand and water play. They also have the opportunity to learn how to surf! We all really enjoyed the sessions.

For SESE the class learned all about our community and did a community walk identifying different services and buildings. They made lovely cityscape artwork. The students also went on scavenger hunts and learnt all about the different types of trees in Ireland. They did leaf rubbings and used leaves to make prints. They learnt all about climate change and created posters. The students have also been enjoying baking and are great at following recipes and getting all the equipment and ingredients set up. During math week the boys had lots of fun finding and solving the 'Principal's Puzzles'. We are now getting excited for Halloween!

It has been a very busy half term and I am very proud of how hard all of my groups have been working! My literacy groups have been busy practising



Ms Maguire S.E.T

All the children in S.E.T have worked very hard this term. They have enjoyed using a multi-sensory approach for learning their spellings. Their favourite multi-sensory spelling approaches include: spelling words using

magnetic letters on old biscuit tin lids, tracing words in flour and writing words on the whiteboard. We have also been working on dictation, sequencing sentences and stories, reading and comprehension strategies. We love to play What's Up?, Go Fish and Hot Seat.
