School Hours

School begins at 9:20 am Junior and Senior Infants finish school at 2:00 pm First-sixth classes finish school at 3:00 pm Break times are 11:00-11:15 am and 1:00-1:25 pm

Assembly/Dismissal 1

Children should line up in an orderly fashion in their designated area at the back of the school each morning. Children should be dropped off at the school between 9:10 and 9.20. Class teachers collect their line from the yard when the school bell rings at 9:20am. On wet mornings, the classroom doors will open at 9.10am. Parents are asked not to park in the designated drop-off zone at the front of the school. This zone is for our school buses.

Uniform

The school expects all children to wear a uniform:

- Navy blue jumper or cardigan
- Navy blue trousers or pinafore
- White shirt
- Red Tie

A separate uniform is required for PE days:



- Navy blue tracksuit top/sweater
- Navy blue tracksuit bottoms

Books/School reports

School books, workbooks and copies are provided by the school. A stationary list is provided each year to parents and there is a small charge for art and craft and insurance expenses. A payment link is provided to parents for this in September and the cost is reviewed annually. Our aim is to keep costs to parents/quardians as low as possible.

School accommodation

The school building has nine large classrooms with en-suite toilets, two learning support rooms, a general purpose/sports hall, a Sensory Room, an outdoor classroom in the center of the building, visitor toilets, a secretary's office, a principal's office and several storage areas.

Externally, we have separate junior and senior tarmac play areas, a basketball court, climbing wall and a sports field. Outdoor play and activity is promoted and fostered. We have a school garden and bike facilities. We participate in Active Flag and Green Flag activities.

The Rock Hub

Named by our pupils, the Rock Hub contains two Autism Specialist Classes. These classes are a wonderful addition to our school and were established in September 2021. The children who are enrolled in our Rock Hub also integrate into our mainstream classes and some of the children in mainstream reverse integrate into our Rock Hub for programmes and activities that may support them in reaching their potential. We are committed to this inclusive approach and all our pupils benefit from this embedded inclusion in our school.

Extra-curricular activities

The school participates in a number of extra-curricular initiatives. In 2019/20 we worked towards achieving an Active Schools Flag, a Health and Wellbeing Flag and an SFI Discover Science and Maths Award. In 2020, we were awarded the Amber Flag for Mental Health and Wellbeing. In 2021 we were awarded the Active School Flag and in 2022 we were awarded the Green School Flag. We continue to work on initiatives in these areas.

We enter a number of inter-school sporting competitions each year including Gaelic football, soccer and athletics. Each year we hold an internal school Gaelic football competition with the emphasis on participation and

enjoyment. An athletics club meets one evening each week after school from February onwards. Swimming lessons are organized for 1st to 6th and our Rock Hub classes in Ballyshannon Leisure Centre. Every summer we hold a sport for all day where our pupils can enjoy lots of different sporting activities, these include mini games, coaching and Zumba!

Teachers are encouraged to organize field trips for their classes throughout the year.

We regularly support dramatic productions and each class stage their own Christmas Show in the school hall. During Christmas 2020 and 2021 each class made a Christmas Mini Movies so families could enjoy performances at home. They were uploaded to our Youtube Channel for everyone to enjoy! Since then we have had live performances in the school and the Rock Hall for Christmas, they are also recorded for family and friens to enjoy. An end of year school trip is organized for each class in June.

<u>ICT</u>

The school has G-Suite for Education and use Google Classroom in Senior Classes and Seesaw in Junior Classes. We have developed the technological infrastructure of the school and all classes have the use of Interactive Panels. We also have a suite of laptops for use in classes and a suite of ipads for use in classes.









Green School Programme

We are participating in the Green Schools Programme. We were awarded the Litter & Waste Flag in 2022. Our aim is to Reduce, Reuse, Recycle. We are now working on achieving our Water Flag and are working on water conservation within the school.

Cycle Bus

Our pupils participate in our Cycle bus every weekly in Autumn and Spring/Summer, weather permitting. We meet in the Mall Park and cycle to school. We are so lucky to have the help of Ballyshannon Gardaí and even other schools in the area have hopped onto our cycle bus!



Communication

The welfare and progress of your child in Holy Family NS is our primary concern. With that in mind we have an open policy with regard to parental communication and home links are strongly encouraged in the following ways:

- Parents/guardians are frequently informed of school activities by email, newsletter or text.

Healthy Eating Policy

The school has a healthy eating policy. We ask parents to ensure that their child bring a wholesome, healthy lunch each day. It should contain fruit, sandwich and a natural drink. On Fridays, children may bring a small treat with them. Fizzy drinks, chewing gum and nuts are prohibited.

Every child in the school receives a free school lunch. As part of the new Deis scheme we have access to funding for full school lunches from January 2023. Our school lunches are provided by Fresh Today and contain a sandwich/wrap/pasta, a piece of fruit and a healthy snack. Water towers are in every class and drinking bottles are provided to all children in the school at no cost to parents.

SPHE

Social Personal and Health Education (SPHE) is a very important element of the school curriculum. SPHE covers a wide range of topics such as selfidentity, making decisions, citizenship and relationships, which equip children with many of the skills and knowledge needed in today's world.

Holy Family NS teaches both the Stay Safe Programme and the RSE Programme as per best practice recommendations. The aim of the Stay Safe Programme is to prevent both physical and sexual abuse of children. The Relationship and Sexuality (RSE) Programme includes the learning, understanding and the development of attitudes, beliefs and values about relationships, sexual identity and intimacy.
